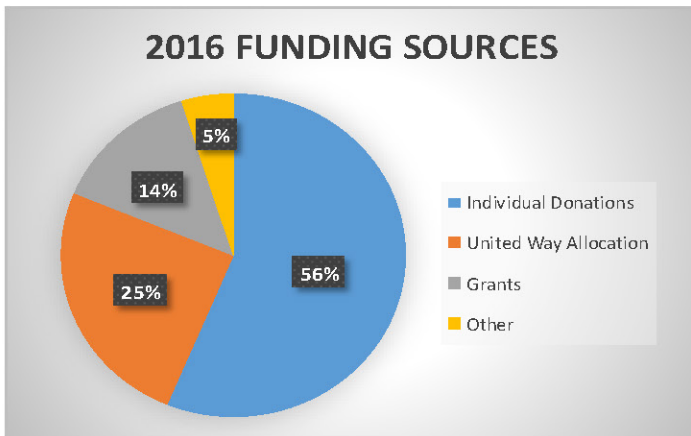

MISSION STATEMENT: The Indianapolis Legal Aid Society is dedicated to ensuring that qualified low-income persons living in the Central Indiana community have immediate and direct access to quality legal assistance for civil disputes.

GEOGRAPHIC SERVICE AREA: Boone, Hamilton, Hancock, Hendricks, Johnson, Marion, Morgan, and Shelby counties.



SERVICES PROVIDED

In 2016, 10,906 individuals contacted the Indianapolis Legal Aid Society (ILAS) for assistance. Of those, 5,524 received individualized services, and ILAS attorneys made 475 court appearances on their behalf.

The majority of legal issues addressed by the Indianapolis Legal Aid Society involved the interests of women, children, and the elderly.

Since 1941, the Indianapolis Legal Aid Society (ILAS) has been giving Central Indiana residents of modest means a voice in their own legal matters by providing clients the opportunity to discuss civil legal matters with knowledgeable, highly-qualified attorneys.

ILAS differs from all other providers in Central Indiana in that it is the only service where individuals are able to meet immediately with an attorney – typically within two to three business days, and pay no attorney fees.

Civil legal aid is a combination of services and resources enabling the poor and disadvantaged to effectively navigate the complicated legal system to protect their livelihoods, their health, and their families.

ILAS provides critically needed direct advice and representation on issues such as adoption, paternity, visitation, guardianship, support, custody, divorce, and housing.

The Indianapolis Legal Aid Society provides services to individuals and families with incomes of less than 125 percent of the federal poverty guideline levels – or just under \$30,000 annually for a family of four.
